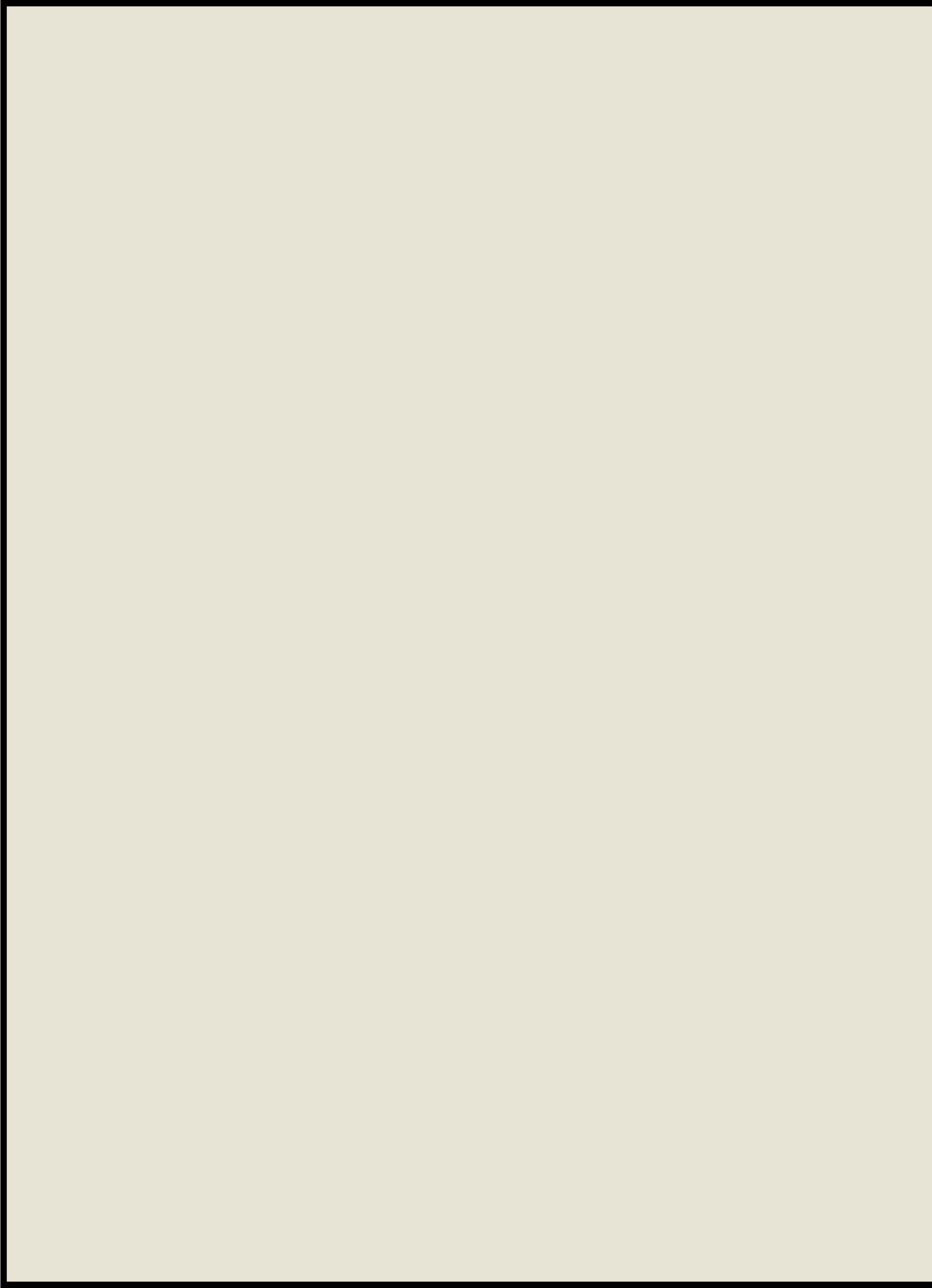
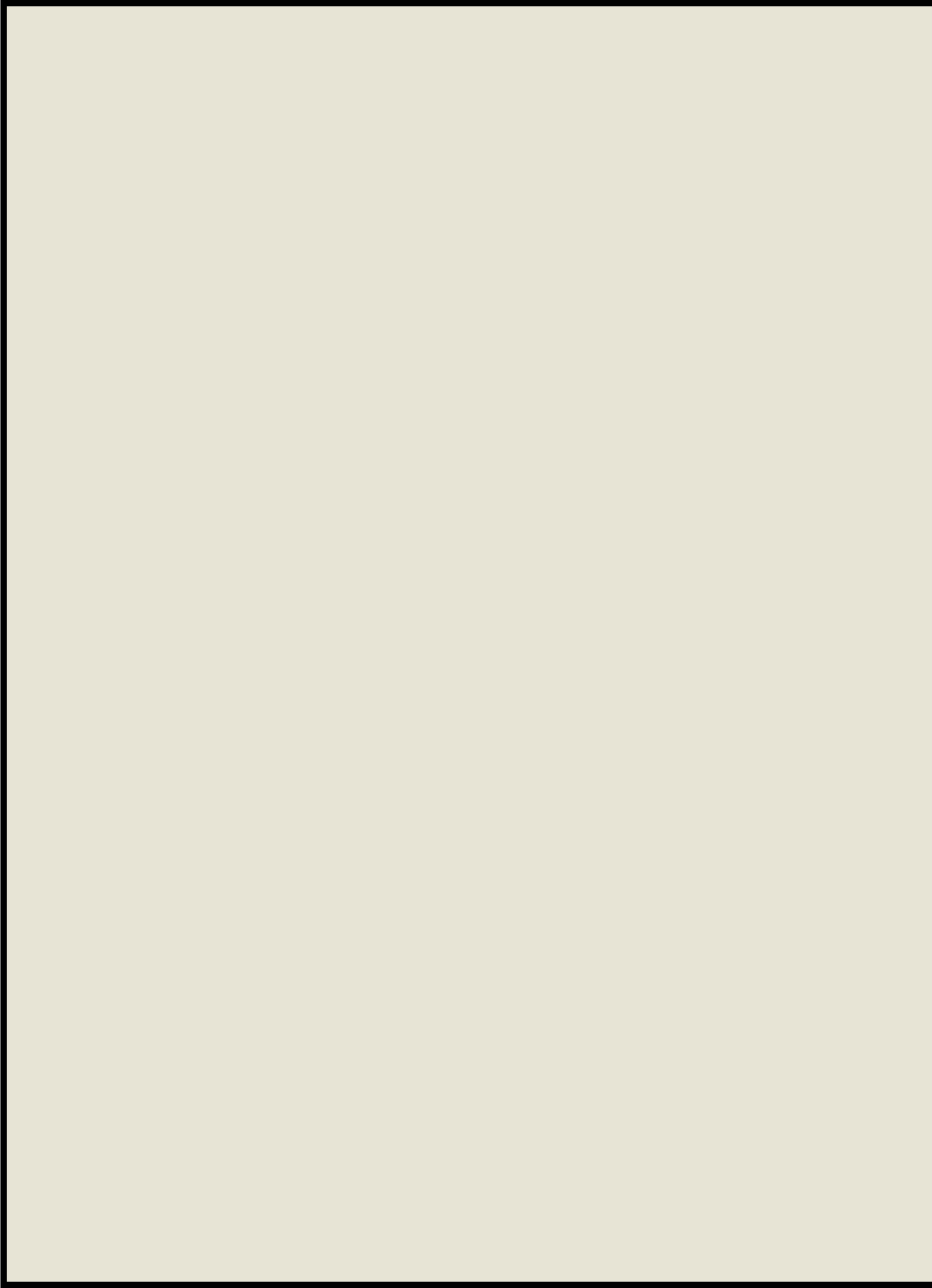

Others who go out into this working world must remember it takes many moons before you can be a success--and only then after hard work, cooperation, and the desire to be successful.


Remember how well you get along with others depends upon you, and you only.

I can still remember today what my superintendent said to us: "Success is attained if you want something badly, and if you want it badly enough you will go after it under any circumstances."

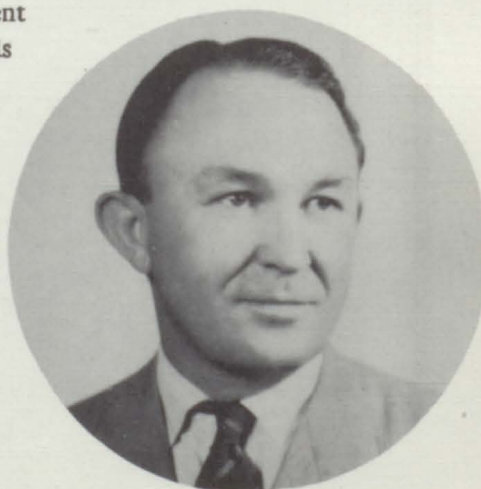

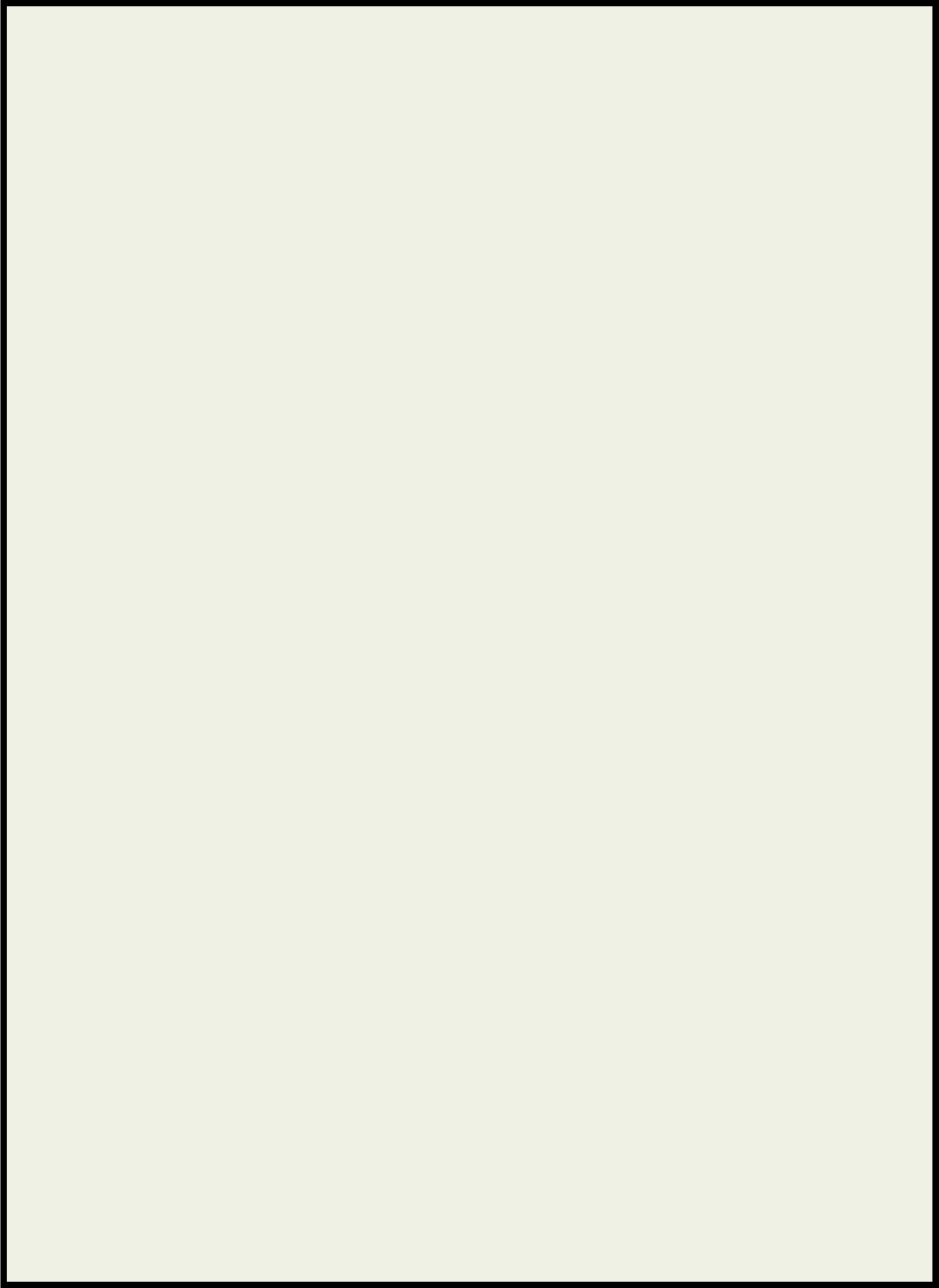
In our junior year, Jim Fox arrived from Castle Rock, Colorado. Mr. Clyde Cheney was our sponsor.
