You can look forward to the atomic and jet ages bringing about many changes, such as atomic transportation, in air, land, and water, atomic electric power, and atomic power for peaceful use.

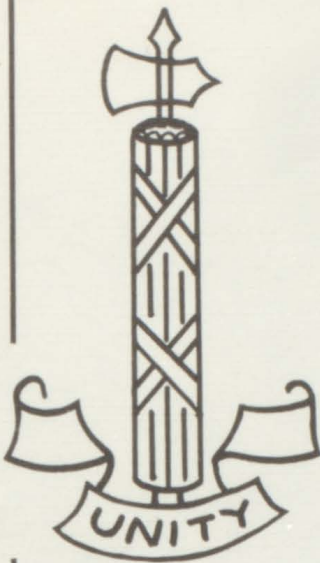
