Frank Bouman sends his regrets that he cannot be here but he is on an interplanetary tour selling his new book, "100 Ways to Extinguish the Human Race."


Mary Behrbaum just walked in. She has taken over Mr. Kloeckner's position as football coach. Congratulations, Mary.
