## Class History

Annette Long Anderson supervised the education of the sixth grade class. We learned to dance that year and Lynn Doyle joined our fast-growing group.

In the seventh grade we gained Marian Poulson. Mr. Robert Shimmel guided the class through their first experiences of junior high school.

Then followed a very exciting eighth grade year, and, although there were no names added to the class roll, a new and beautiful grade school was being occupied for the first time. Mr. Werner Pohle acted as foreman of the class.

Finally, in September of 1956, the Class of ' 60 entered Idaho Springs High School as freshmen. Besides the old members, Wayne Disque, Jerry Romarine, Fred Powell, Barbara Churchey, Mary Preskar, and Lynn Miles were now a part of the group. It was then that we also gained Dr. Robert Kainer, who that year guided us through freshman initiation and the tragic burning of our bonfire by persons unknown. Our first year in high school was one of parties and fun!

With Dr. Kainer as our class sponsor, we started our sophomore year with two new additions, Eladio Garcia and Mary Horn. It was a time of hard work both scholastically and athletically. But fun prevailed and we ended the year with a gay trip to Lakeside Amusement Park.

As our junior year began, we gained Dave Ficklin, who had left us in 1954, Wes Cannady, Ron Sampson, and Clyde Ruonovar. Mrs. Ann Williams and Dr. Kainer were co-sponsors of our class. It was an exciting year in which we presented our class play, "The Night of January 16 th, " and hosted the Junior-Senior Prom, "Enchanted Garden." We also participated in the all-school pageant celebrating one hundred years of Colorado history.

Reorganization brought four Georgetown students to our class in the fall of '59. They are Bettsy Haines, Jerry Buckley, Fred Leighton, and Florence Griffin. Also joining our class were Alec Hitchman, Bob Sutter, Dennie Borgens, and Jim Bennett. With Dr. Kainer and Mr. Mackey guiding our class activities, we have had a very successful year which was highlighted, of course, by the long-awaited senior sneak trip. With graduation at hand we are near the end of our journey through the Idaho Springs public schools. To the fine people of Clear Creek County who have made our education possible goes our deepest gratitude. We shall strive to be a credit to our school and all it has come to mean to us.
