Cross Country

The 2010 cross country season was a big success for both the girls and the boys teams. A preview of the success was evident early in the season with a fine showing at the Horizon High School meet held at the Adams County Fairgrounds. Both teams placed first at the Platte Canyon Invitational. The notoriously muddy Kiowa course was little problem where the girls placed 2nd, while the boys cruised to a 1st place finish. This was followed up by a tremendous showing by the boys team at the Horizon/Runners Roost Invitational, where they placed 5th. At the Frontier League Championships the girls finished 2nd, the highest finish for the girls team in the past decade and the boys defended their reign of the league championships for the fourth consecutive year. The Golddigger boys finished fourth at the regional race and qualified for the state championship. Teri Heffner and Krista Hatrick both qualified as individuals for the state meet. At the state meet, the boys finished 15th overall. Teri and Krista finished 74th and 91st respectively. Overall, Another successful season for the Golddigger Harriers.

Creek High School program.



great year of choir!










