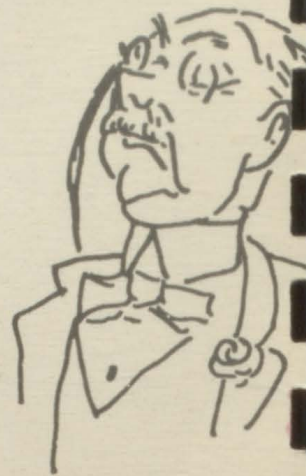

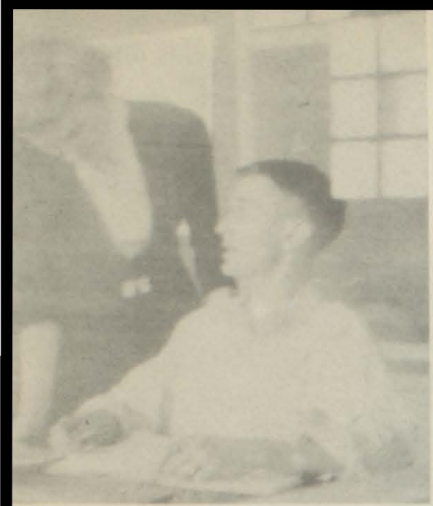
## SPANISH CLUB

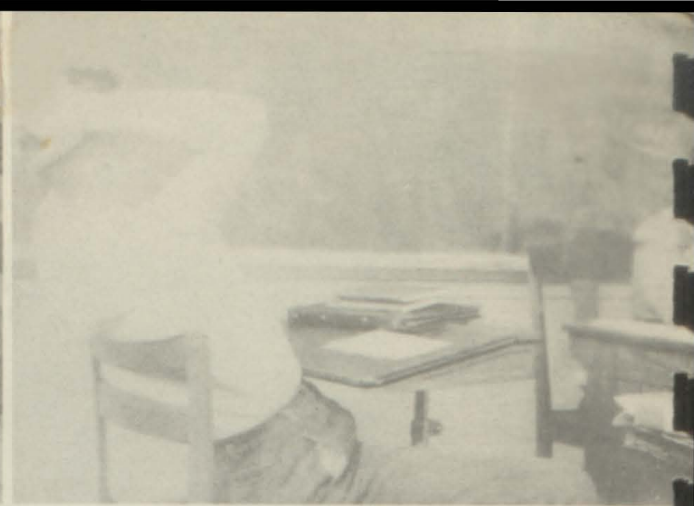

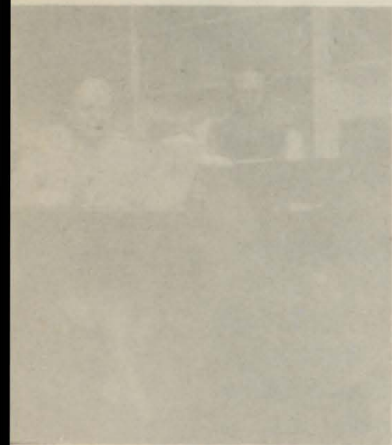

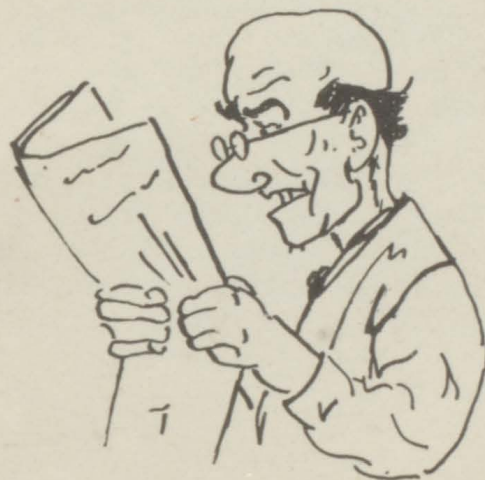
