In December the class piled into a pickup and took off for Evergreen and an evening of ice skating and eating.

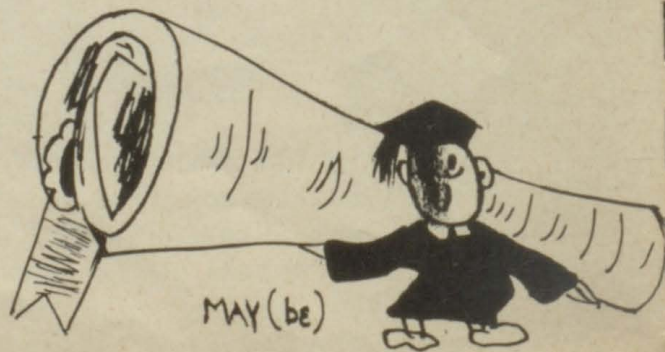

Junior Prom

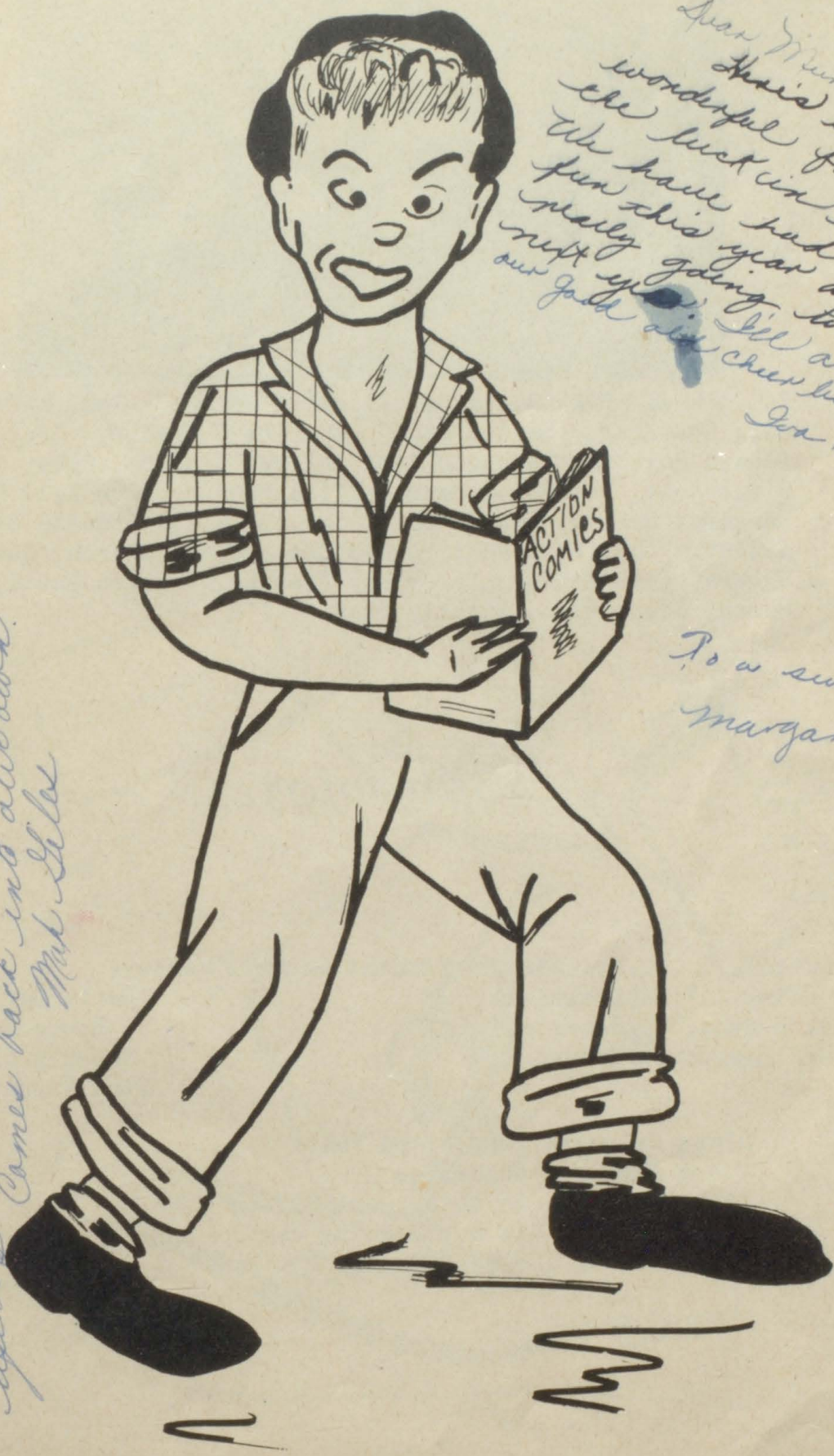

On Purple and Gold eight students received the Echo pin of merit.

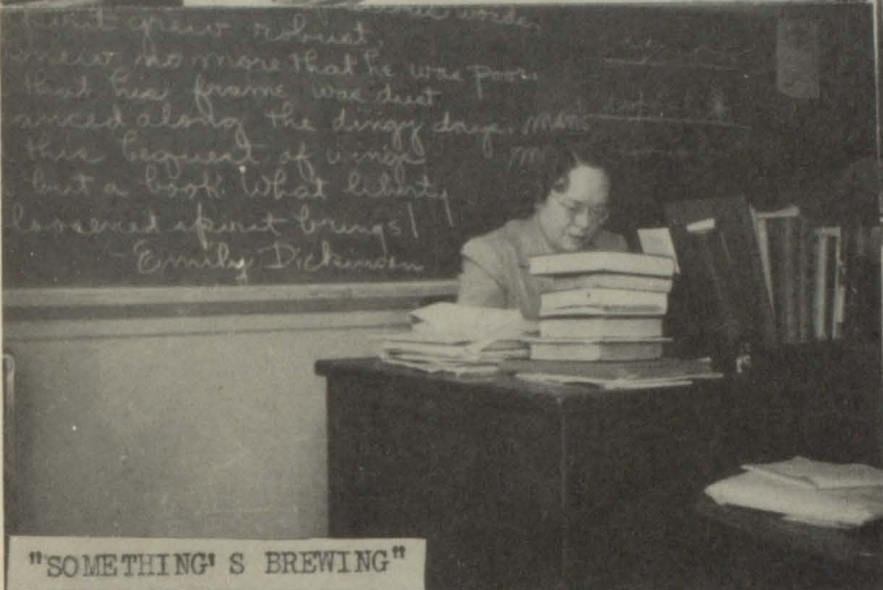

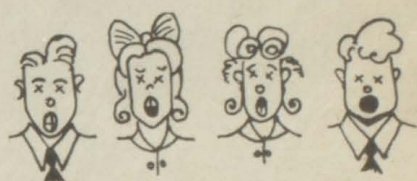
The Student Council has given two very good parties this school term and are to be complimented for the many other things that they have done.
