## Racing Toward 2020

Presidential candidates campaign full force ahead of state primaries and caucuses. The University of Tennessee mascot wears the shirt that became a national sensation after a story of a young boy bullied for wearing a handdrawn UT paper on an orange shirt for his school's college day went viral. UT made his design into an official shirt that sold out within minutes, with profits going to an anti-bullying organization. The university offered him a four-year scholarship.

## Hong Kong protests

Over 800,000 Hong Kong residents marched in the streets in December during the Civil Human Rights Front Human Rights Day March. The pro-democracy march was the largest to date in the ongoing feud between Hong Kong and mainland China. Protesters called it a last chance for China to meet their demands for human rights.


## Modern History

Plans for restoration begin immediately following the fiery blaze that consumed Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris while the world watched in horror. While disagreements ensued over the best plans to restore the 900 -year-old cathedral, large and small donors pledged $\$ 960$ million toward it. The government stated repairs would be completed in five years.

Cruising to the Rescue Royal Caribbean's cruise ship Mariner of the Seas hosts victims of Hurricane Dorian in the Bahamas. Refugees received shelter, food and transportation after the city of Freeport was devastated by the hurricane in September. Royal Caribbean and many other companies donated to disaster relief organizations to rebuild the area.

Desperate Admissions
Actress Felicity Huffman and her husband William H. Macy walk out of her sentencing hearing. Hưffman and fellow actress Lori Laughlin were among the parents and coaches indicted in a college bribery scandal that alleged parents paid a consultant to alter test scores or attempted to pass their children off falsely as athletic recruits to gain admissions. Huffman was sentenced to 14 days in prison.


## Desert Storm

Extraterrestrial enthusiasts gather at the infamous Area 51 despite military warnings. College student Matty Roberts created a Facebook event called "Storm Area 51, They Can't Stop All of Us" as a joke, but it soon went viral with millions marked as Going or Interested. The event later transformed into a music festival called AlienStock.



Pawsitive News
After decades of Breed-specific Legislation (BSL), many cities begin lifting bans on pit bull breeds, meaning more get adopted from shelters into fur-ever homes. Hundreds of cities adopted BSL beginning in the 1980s when pit bulls were portrayed as dangerous and aggressive, sometimes banning dogs that even had a resemblance to the breed. Brexit Stage Left Workers remove the United Kingdom's flag outside of the European Parliament in Brussels, Belgium, as they officially leave the European Union (EU) on Jan. 31. The country first voted for Brexit, as Britain's exit from the EU was coined, in 2016 by a narrow margin, leaving the kingdom bitterly divided. The removal was delayed numerous times when Britain and the EU failed to reach a trade agreement that received enough votes in British Parliament to pass.

## A Life Remembered

U.S. Representative Elijah Cummings of Baltimore becomes the first African American lawmaker to lie in state at the U.S. Capitol. Cummings, who served in Congress since 1996, died in October from long-standing health complications. He was the son of sharecroppers who became a civil rights leader admired by both sides of the political aisle.

## CALIFORNIA - March 10, 2020

Organizers announce they're postponing Coachella, the massive two-weekend music festival estimated to draw a crowd of 250,000.

March 19: The entire state of California is ordered to stay home as the pandemic death toll climbs in the state.

## TEXAS - March 6, 2020

South by Southwest, the annual tech, film and music conference based in Austin, Texas, announces it's canceling the events scheduled to take place from March 13 to March 22.

## Crisis Around the World

## NEW YORK - March 12, 2020

New York governor Andrew Cuomo bans gatherings of 500 or more people, causing many of the nation's most popular tourist attractions, including Broadway theaters, to shut their doors.

## MASSACHUSETTS - March 9, 2020

City officials in Boston cancel the upcoming St. Patrick's Day parade, and cities around the nation soon do the same. After initial resistance, the Boston Athletic Association announced March 13 they would reschedule the Boston Marathon from April 20 to Sept. 14.

## MISSOURI - March 12, 2020

The NCAA announces the immediate suspension of all Conference championships, resulting in the cancellation of the Big 12 Basketball Championships in Kansas City, Missouri. The organization had already barred fans from attending games.

## KENTUCKY - March 17, 2020

The Kentucky Derby is rescheduled from May 2 to Sept. 5, the first time since 1945 that America's longest continuously held sports event won't occur on the traditional first Saturday in May.

## KANSAS - March 17, 2020

Kansas Governor Laura Kelly closes all K-12 school buildings for the remainder of the school year, ordering districts to implement remote learning for students.

## TENNESSEE - March 13, 2020

The Grand Ole Opry closes to the public but continues to provide livestreamed concerts free of charge, a nod to its origins as a live radio broadcast.

## FLORIDA - March 12, 2020

Disney and Universal Studios announce plans to close their North American theme parks, plus Disney's park in Paris, France. Walt Disney World in Orlando, Florida, and Disneyland in Anaheim, California, announced they would donate all excess food to local food banks.

## LOUISIANA - March 13, 2020

Louisiana officials announce they're rescheduling the state's presidential primary vote from April 4 to May 19. Louisiana was the first state to announce a delay in voting but was soon followed by several more states, including Georgia and Ohio.

## 5 Cline

A barber offers Doctor Liu Zhiping a free haircut at the medical team residence of Hankou Hospital in Wuhan on Feb. 24 to celebrate Longtaitou Day, all while taking extra precautions for his health. The Chinese considered it good luck to have their hair cut on that day, so over 100 barbers volunteered their time and gave nearly 4,000 medical workers a haircut that week. Though the devastating outbreak started in China, their preventative measures slowed the spread of the virus.


Seven-year-old Pier Paolo refuses to let the quarantine in Rome steal his joy, choosing to play his trumpet for neighbors. Musical flash mobs erupted in neighborhoods affected by the lockdown as a way to spread cheer during the COVID-19 pandemic. Italy was one of the hardest hit nations, and their death toll surpassed China.


France becomes the first nation to close all of its schools. The aggressive measure was implemented as a way to flatten the curves of the outbreak; however, many parents were left with few options for childcare without school. As the effects of the virus worsened, France and other European nations took additional steps to stem the tide and assist residents impacted.

FEB. 29 The U.S. increases travel restrictions for South Korea, Iran and Italy. There are 85,000 confirmed cases worldwide.

MARCH 11 U.S. restricts travel from Europe, except Britain and Ireland.

MARCH 13 U.S. declares a state of emergency. Seattle and Ohio close schools. Urgent care clinics in Hawaii offer drive-through testing.
 passes the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) guaranteeing free coronavirus testing, paid sick leave and boosting unemployment insurance and food safety programs.

MARCH 17 Total cases reach 198,000 with death toll at 7,900 . U.S. has 4,660 confirmed cases and 85 deaths. All 50 states report having COVID-19. The White House urges citizens to avoid gatherings of more than 10 people and calls for the closure of bars, gyms, restaurants and other venues. Government proposes stimulus checks to be sent to each American. Shelter in place order issued in San Francisco Bay area, and New York promises to do the same.

FEB. 27 Australia's prime minister says a pandemic is inevitable.

MARCH 5 Congress passes an $\$ 8.3$ billion emergency spending bill. Virus spreads to at least 14 states. Maryland is first state to declare state of emergency. California and Oregon waive cost-sharing for COVID-19 testing.

MARCH 16 Schools in 39 states are closed temporarily. Kansas is first to announce all K-12 schools will not return to the classroom this school year.

MARCH 18 Border between U.S. and Canada closes.
